Review of October Talks

Science Group: Magical Nanotechnology

The Science Group was treated to a fascinating talk by Professor Dave Leigh of Manchester University.

The title of the talk was **Making the Tiniest Machines** through the use of nanotechnology. This has been called the ultimate game changer. A nano is incredibly small, a millionth of a molecule. The miniaturisation of machines has led to nanotechnology with biology and chemistry heavily intertwined in its future potential.

At a time when positive news is a little thin on the ground, according to a recent Nobel Prizewinner in Chemistry we are at the dawn of a new industrial revolution. This technology will have a beneficial impact on the use of the earths resources as it is more frugal in the use of energy.

Professor's Leigh's presentation was lightened by his abilities as a Magician and the performance of several highly impressive magic tricks would alone would be worthy of a talk!

Usher Syndrome

This talk was given by Amy on behalf Helen who suffers from Usher Syndrome which has caused her to be Blind and Deaf. There are 450,000 in the UK who suffer from Usher Syndrome, estimated to rise to 600,000 in the next 15 years as the population ages. There are estimated to be 1.6 million sufferers worldwide.

Usher Syndrome is the main cause of blindness and is inherited genetically from both parents. People affected are denoted by carrying a white stick with red hoops and if they have a Guide Dog it will have a red and white harness.

Despite her condition Helen has performed at the Royal Exchange where she has also written and directed a play.

On 1st November the United Reformed Church Hall saw the latest **Repair Cafe** in Wilmslow. Similar to the BBC's Repair Shop willing and skilled volunteers repair broken items brought in by the public. This includes electrical goods; furniture; fabrics & clothing; jewellery and toys. There is also cakes and tea / coffee. There is no charge though a donation, which goes to charity, is welcome.
